

Postoperative Instructions for:

Temporary Crowns

What to Expect after Treatment:

- After the temporary crown has been placed, it will feel rough in texture; however the final crown will feel smooth like your natural tooth.
- Your teeth may feel hot/cold sensitive after the procedure, the sensitivity should subside within the first week
- If your Temporary Crown happens to fall off in one piece please call our office and let us know so we can re-cement it for you. If it breaks off into small pieces we will fabricate a new one

How to care for your Temporary Crown:

- Your gums can become inflamed if they are not cared for properly
- If you are instructed to floss around the Temporary Crown you must see-saw the floss to get between the contacts, then pull the floss out by the side. **DO NOT** pull the floss up or down as this can dislodge the Temporary Crown
- **AVOID** eating foods such as – caramel, nuts, raw veggies, gum, sticky or chewy foods
- Do not disturb the Temporary Crown
- You may do a salt water rinse if you are experiencing any discomfort, If discomfort persists please call the office and let us know

Do not be alarmed if the crown breaks or comes off, this can happen

Return to the office for the follow-up appointments
